April Greetings!


I wish you a meaningful holy week and a happy and blessed Easter, dear church.

Addressing Hunger As FoodShare Benefits Are Reduced

Beginning in March, the FoodShare households will receive only their regular benefit at the beginning of the month, not the additional payment they had been receiving (Covid relief). Seniors and families may see their \$281 monthly benefit drop to \$23. How can we respond and support?

- Continued support of Immanuel Food Pantry anticipating an increased demand not only from the loss of FoodShare benefits but also from the rising costs of food, gas, and other necessities due to inflation. Watch last week's WCC Wednesday to learn about how one church is responding through a Community Fridge on their property.
- Advocate for anti-hunger policies like improvements to SNAP when the federal Farm Bill is reauthorized.
- Learn about the extent, causes, consequences, and solutions to hunger in your community. One place to start is <u>WCC's Hunger at Our Doorstep: A Study-Action Guide for Congregations</u>.

In a moment of deep ecological crisis, this year's EcoFaith Summit calls us to become part of the Holy Spirit's subversive plot to pollinate an alternative way of being human for the sake of life. In this plot, we find our model and hope from pollinator species. These tiny, apparently powerless, often overlooked and disregarded creatures, whose drastic decline endangers so much we depend upon, are a key to the regeneration of life itself. Through worship, a keynote



presentation, diverse storytellers, conversations, and engagement sessions, together we will be empowered to be participants in this unfolding plot.
