

In our gospel readings for August, we will hear stories of Jesus that will cause us to feel wonder and awe! When we allow ourselves to hear these stories anew, we can't help but see how miraculous the ministry of Jesus was. We see Jesus feeding more than 5000 people with five loaves and two fish! We will witness Jesus walking on the water after time alone in prayer. We will experience the instant healing of a daughter who was tormented. And then we will reflect on some less tangible miracles that nonetheless, cause us to wonder at the mysterious and generous workings of God! Things like Jesus allowing us to forgive in his name,

and Jesus teaching that he will have to suffer and die and rise again in order to fulfill his mission. All of these wondrous parts of Jesus ministry will be part of our learning this month in worship.

When we experience the miracles of Jesus in the Bible, it gives us a miraculous lens in which to see the world. Like Peter, our faith at times is weak. Still, Jesus gives us the gift of grace and allows us to share this gift with the world. Truly, that is the most important miracle of all.

There are all sorts of ways to think about miracles. We can imagine the miracles of Jesus. We can think about the ordinary wonders in creation and in the human experience. We can focus on the spiritual miracles that happen as a person learns and grows. Spiritual teacher Marianne Williamson teaches that a miracle is a shift in perspective from fear to love. Albert Einstein has a famous quote stating, "There are only two ways to live your life. One is as though nothing is a miracle. The other is as though everything is a miracle." Jesus said, "with God all things are possible." (Matthew 19:26). How do you define a miracle?

What miracles have you experienced in your life? What miracles are you praying for, for our world and our collective future?

God of miracles, open our hearts to the wonder of this world. Bless us with awakenings of joy as we journey with you and those you have placed in our pathway. Amen


Middle School Youth

OPPORTUNITY TO HELP OUR IMMIGRANT NEIGHBORS



The JONAH Immigration Task Force has joined together with JONAH, AMMPARO (Accompanying Migrant Minors with Protection, Advocacy, Representation and Opportunities; with local ELCA representation), El Centro de Conexión, (the local Latino organization) and St. Mary's Roman Catholic Parish to establish a fund, "Neighbors Helping Neighbors," to help our immigrant friends with basic needs—food, rent, energy assistance--- during the Covid-19 crisis. Immanuel Lutheran Trust Fund has provided seed money. These hard-working men and women have been disproportionately impacted by lay-offs because of the jobs that they had, and many are not eligible for any type of government assistance. JONAH members, faith communities, and others in the Chippewa Valley have asked how they could help our neighbors; this fund is the answer.

Bilingual interviewers will talk with the applicants, and the requests will be forwarded to an executive committee of constituent groups. St. Mary's, which has a Spanish language worship service and has thus established a relationship with many of these community members, will be the fiduciary agent for contributions and will disperse the funds.

The need is great. Right now the emphasis will probably be on food; once the rent moratorium ends, paying rent will become essential if these families hope to avoid being evicted. As we provide financial support, we also hope to begin to establish a caring community among our immigrant neighbors in Eau Claire.
