
A Different Beginning From trauma to hope in Matthew's gospel By Pastor Jamie Brieske

"You'll never guess what happened at the store today!" "I'm really sorry to have to tell you this." "Oh this reminds me of the time..." "You really have to know what happened twenty years ago to understand this situation."

The way a story begins sets the stage for the impact and meaning that story will carry. It is true in our everyday lives and it is true in the biblical sense. Let me tell you the story of Jesus, but I have to start at the beginning. And by the beginning, I mean the day that Rachel wept because all of the male babies in Bethlehem were killed by Herod. All the male babies under two. All of Jesus' cousins on his Dad's side. Maybe even some of the grandmas and aunties and moms who refused to give up their little ones to the state. But not Jesus. Jesus was spared because his dad Joseph was warned in a dream to flee to flee to Egypt. From the beginning, Jesus was the one who survived. Jesus' entire childhood is a story of trauma, state violence, a family on the run, and survivor guilt.

Jesus' story as told by Matthew begins with trauma. Matthew is the only gospel to share the story of Herod killing the children and it's also the only gospel to refer to Jesus as Immanuel, *God with us*. Suddenly *God with us* means more than it ever has. God is with us when we have endured the absolute worst of humanity. God is with us in the messy reality of war, abuse, pain, and PTSD. God is with the refugees who had to run from violence. God is with the women and children in detention centers. God is with the families left behind. God is with the lonely, the scared, the forgotten and oppressed of this world. That day in Bethlehem, Jesus was the only one left, and his very name means, *God saves*, as well as Immanuel, *God with us*.

This fall the pastors of our synod attended a continuing education event called, "Provoking the Gospel of Matthew." The presentation was based on the biblical commentary by the same name written by our presenter, Richard Swanson. In addition to studying Matthew's gospel, we also heard the beginning and the end of the gospel, told by storyteller Pam Faro. When you hear the beginning of Matthew's gospel spoken aloud you can't help but see the pain and terror of the slaughter of the innocents. You can't help but hear the



pain in Rachel's voice as she wails for God's children. You can't help but see that it is significant that Matthew begins his Jesus story in this way.

In Advent, we begin the church year anew and this year we will focus on Matthew's gospel. Perhaps it's perfect timing to hear this "traumainformed gospel" as Richard Swanson calls it, and wonder what God might be up to in our world today. Perhaps God has a word of good news for immigrants and refugees, for survivors of school shootings, for victims of hatred and abuse, for veterans suffering with PTSD. Perhaps God has a word of hope for all of us who see the crushing pain of this world and cry out, how long God?

Our story begins with God arriving in the cruel reality of this world in flesh and blood, Immanuel, God with us. Let's see where this story leads us in this new church year. Perhaps we may find a road to healing for ourselves and for this hurting world God loves so deeply.

People of Immanuel: God sees you. God is with you in your new beginning.

AMMPARO at Immanuel

"Dios es nuestro amparo y fortaleza," ("God is our refuge and strength,")-Psalm 46:1

AMMPARO is a holistic, whole church commitment by the ELCA, as a church in the world, to accompany children today and in the future.

The word "amparo" in Spanish means the protection of a living creature from suffering or damage. The ELCA's strategy to Accompany Migrant Minors with Protection, Advocacy, Representation and Opportunities (AMMPARO) was envisioned after witnessing the plight of children who are forced to flee their communities in Central America and Mexico because of complex and interrelated reasons, including chronic violence, poverty, environmental displacement and lack of opportunities.

Immanuel has become a partner with the ELCA's AMMPARO ministry and has begun to work on how we see this fitting into our ministry as a "Church Without Walls". Our first action will be to present a "Migrant's Journey", an interactive simulation developed by AMMPARO ELCA. The goal is to increase public awareness of the reasons families from Central America and Mexico are forced to flee their homes and the kinds of things they experience and witness along the way. We will be presenting this simulation during an Adult Forum in January at Immanuel and at the Synod's Walking Together event at UWEC on February 22, 2020.
