During my internship year we celebrated Pentecost at Hope Lutheran Church by reading the story from Acts in several different languages... at the same time! I was charged to read from the original Greek. I studied up on my pronunciations so that I could do an adequate job for worship. As you can imagine, hearing the story in four different languages at the same time sounds very chaotic. Yet, it reminded us all that the first Pentecost was very chaotic. The disciples were distraught after the death of Jesus. Yes, he had promised to be with them and to send an Advocate, but they still had no idea what that meant. The rush of the Spirit in a great wind and tongues of fire was probably exhilarating, but also terrifying for them as they were hid away in the upper room. The Spirit drove them out to preach to the people. The message of Jesus' presence, peace, and reign could not be shut up in a room or confined to one group of people.



The Spirit is not orderly, it pushes us beyond our comfort zone. It reminds us that we are not in control- but there is a force far more powerful at work in our lives and in our world. For a few moments as we read the Pentecost story in English, Greek, Spanish and French we were reminded of the chaos of Pentecost. Words and phrases here and there would stand out to people listening: "The rush of a violent wind... every nation under heaven... Amazed and astonished... What does this mean?..." And in closing we all returned to say the last line together in English saying, "Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved."



- 8. **PRIOR TO MEETINGS**, provide as much pertinent information as possible regarding each item to be brought to council for consideration.
- 9. **FOCUS** on issues not personalities.
- 10. TALK TO THE PERSON, NOT ABOUT THE PERSON.
- 11. **BE FRIENDS** by uplifting each other with encouragement.
- 12. HAVE PERSONAL RELATIONSHIPS WITH EACH COUNCIL MEMBER.

A Covenant for Immanuel Members and Guests who attend meetings of the Church Council:

- We will abide by the spirit of the Council's Covenant, as listed above.
- 2. We recognize that while we have the right to be present, the Council has work to do and thus may not entertain participation from members and guests in attendance. We will therefore sit where we can observe quietly so the Council can discuss and deliberate.
- 3.
