




Minutes

February minutes were approved via email and submitted for publication in The Image.

Old Business

Executive Team Motion:

The Immanuel Executive Team moves to return to in-person worship on Sunday, April 11, 2021. We further move that outdoor only worship may be held Palm and Easter Sundays preceding. In returning to in-person worship we will utilize recommendations from the CDC, local health officials and our COVID team. Worship may be cancelled by the executive team or council if needed.

Each member of council was given time for a brief statement to discuss the motion. (2 minutes per member) Remarks from council members reflect the great deal of appreciation and trust we have in the COVID team's planning and researching to provide protocols for outdoor worship, indoor worship, and other building/grounds use. Along with supporting indoor worship protocols, members discussed concerns related to unforeseen occurrences, such as drop-in visitors for worship or building use and how to mitigate this and minimize exposure to volunteers and staff. Discussion and importance was placed on further development of the sanctuary seating layout design(s) and methods for seating arrangements for indoor worship and on maintaining and utilizing records from indoor worship to guide and inform next steps or future steps.

Questions/discussion following initial remarks:

- •What is the maximum capacity with appropriate spacing for indoor worship? For now 50 people with families 6 ft apart will be the maximum used for indoor worship. It is noted that the average Sunday attendance for worship prior to the closure was approximately 100 people.
- •Council will continue to be cognizant of those not able to be included in the move to indoor worship yet.
- •Currently the seating available provides for 80 seats, but the planning will be made for 50 seats at this time. No seating will be open in Luther Hall yet. As other levels of indoor worship take place, Kitty will share ideas for other layout formats and for such protocols.
- •We have to be vigilant; we are affecting community spread.
- •Recommendations by the council of churches caution that there should be careful monitoring for 4 weeks before increasing the number of participants in indoor worship and reducing the number if necessary, even during a 4-week session.

Karen made an amended motion:

I move this motion be amended by substituting, that we resume the outdoor worship option (weather permitting) on Palm Sunday, 2021 while concurrently providing the virtual option, following the protocols for infection control from COVID team and public health authorities, subject to cancellation by the executive team or council at any time.

And that we resume indoor worship on April 11, 2021 while concurrently providing the virtual and outdoor options, following protocols for infection control from COVID team and public health authorities, subject to cancellation by the executive team or council at any time.

Jennifer seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

Reports (2-3 minutes each) All reports are available on the shared drive.

<u>Pastor</u> - A highlight this past month was that home visits were added due to vaccinations in place. Hannah Olson has been granted her special ordination request and would like to be ordained at Immanuel in June.

<u>Property</u> - no written report; Kim has returned to duties at Immanuel. Heating and cooling inspection may be coming up very soon. Question: re-installation of the organ - arriving on Monday

Finance - report shared

A motion to accept the reports from Pastor, property committee, and finance committee was made by Sandy, seconded by Bob, and approved unanimously.

<u>COVID Team Report</u> - Protocols for confirmation, outdoor worship, and indoor worship are in the shared folder. In anticipation of more requests for groups to meet, COVID team will meet and discuss these forms/applications submitted for consideration and planning. The preschool staff will work with the COVID team to put together a graduation.

A motion was made by Karen: I move that the high school small group be permitted to resume indoor meeting options while concurrently providing the virtual option, following the infection control protocol for confirmation

The motion was seconded by Lang and unanimously approved.

Adjournment - Pastor closed in prayer

A motion to adjourn was made by Emilie, seconded by Natalie, and passed unanimously.

New Business

Summer outdoor worship at Phoenix Park – A partnership between five Eau Claire ELCA churches has been proposed to provide worship and outreach to the Eau Claire community via summer worship (June through August) at 10:00 am every Sunday by meeting at Phoenix Park in the amphitheater. Two Sundays are designated for Immanuel to provide the worship team; Tammy, the praise band, and Pastor. There are small fees for the amphitheater use (\$65 fee) and to rent the sound system (\$100). Immanuel would have a worship date on July 18th and another in August. A few volunteers may be needed. An offering will be collected to put towards the community outreach. No communion will be served. Sandy LaValley asked about the COVID-19 infection control planning for the event. Guidelines for the city (Phoenix Park) and the county will be followed for COVID precautions including recommending the wearing of masks and social distancing, but this is a public space so some factors will be out of the control or management of the group. The original collaboration that began three summers ago (2019 with three churches), was intended to be continued in 2020 with more churches and is now being reconsidered with 5 churches for this summer as it is a good collaboration and outreach to the community. The worship will be communicated to others through the Community Table, shelters, and other organizations. Bob asked for clarification whether this proposal is intended to completely replace all outdoor worship in the parking lot at Immanuel. Discussion will continue as this would likely replace current outdoor worship for Immanuel's parking lot over the summer. The indoor service and livestream worship at 9:00 a.m. will continue either way. Consideration for inclusion of others in which driving, seating, an open, public presence, etc. may pose a challenge vs Immanuel's parking lot will be discussed in the near future. Brittney described areas in Phoenix Park that are accessible to persons with disabilities. Karen described multiple barriers to attending for persons with disabilities, the elderly and/or those with COVID risk levels that would exclude them from this activity in Phoenix Park. We communicated to the congregation a hybrid model offering three different worship options (virtual, outdoor and indoor), that entail three different levels of COVID risk to include the most people in an option beyond virtual.

Motion: A motion to approve the planning of two outdoor services by the Immanuel worship team to participate in the Phoenix Park worship schedule was made by Sandy, seconded by Jennifer, and passed with a majority vote.

*Follow up ideas for consideration: input from the congregation to be collected versus informing the congregation of the change from the current model of three worship options; consideration of risk factors as not everyone can worship indoors.

<u>Confirmation</u> – There are two classes of students (spring 2020 and spring 2021) to be confirmed this spring. A plan was proposed in which the classes/students are divided into two services for May 23rd in addition to the regular service. Discussion is on-going around the possibility for increased attendance for the confirmation services, if the data and/or council determine we are ready to increase attendance, as an outdoor service is not ideal for a confirmation ceremony.

Motion: A motion to support the planning of two confirmation services for May 23rd was made by Sandy and seconded by Bob. Discussion: In the planning, worship will continue to follow protocols for indoor worship service with the same protocols. There would be a 9:00 a.m. service followed by the two other services for confirmation. The idea of an outdoor reception was discussed. There would be no punch/cake/refreshments.

There would be a time to say hello between groups/services. Masks and distances will be in place and this would be like a parking lot greeting following weddings we have more recently had. Some questions arise as to whether this is different in terms of protocols. COVID Team feels they would need to evaluate the gathering.

Bob expressed it may be appropriate at this time to stay at 50 members for four weeks and evaluate before adjusting. May 9th would be the start of four weeks. Although we are well under the Eau Claire County recommendations of 50% capacity, allowing for seating with 6-ft between seating/groups is more the issue. We need to let confirmation families know what to expect for planning purposes. Jennifer discussed how those family members who are unable to attend in the church can gather at the confirmands home to watch the livestream and celebrate together.

Motion: An amended motion to plan for two indoor services on May 23rd with a maximum of 50 people at each service with indoor worship protocols in place and without the 'outdoor reception' was made by Sandy, seconded by Bob, and passed by council.

<u>Small group requests</u> – Small groups would like to return to meeting in-person at Immanuel. COVID team would like to keep safety first as well as the importance of inclusion. There are individuals not eligible for safety measures, such as vaccinations, like children under 16 or those not able to vaccinate based on medical or belief-based reasons. With thought and caring we would like all to be welcome to participate and to be as inclusionary as we can, including others whose risk levels vary from others. Groups are expected to follow these protocols and COVID is hopeful this basic and generic draft will be found appropriate for many small groups who want to meet at Immanuel, with special accommodations or precautions provided to different groups if they have specific needs.

Motion: A motion to approve the small group protocol as presented by the COVID Team was made by Karen and seconded by Becky C.

Amendment: Small groups could call the church office with the date, time, and location of the group meeting with Dee Schlieve as their contact. Dee would then contact the COVID Team.

Amended Motion: Small groups will go through Dee to complete the forms and answer questions about what is needed for the small group protocol as presented by the COVID team. Dee will be the primary contact and coordinate with Karen. The amended motion passed unanimously.

Reports

<u>Pastor</u> – The report is online. Sandy and Brittany joined the Synod assembly. Council and Pastor Jaimie would like to thank them for their participation. Sandy and Brittany found it to be a wonderful experience.

<u>Property</u> – Aiden T. has proposed an Eagle Scout project that will be a community service project benefiting the church grounds. Aiden has proposed to build picnic benches and place them at the entrance of the meditation trail, groom the meditation trail, add stepping stones, and then improve the firepit by adding bricks around the fire pit. The proposal was shared to the property committee and Council for approval. The time and expense will be covered by Aiden and his supporters. We will investigate any insurance concerns for Scouts to be doing work on the property as well as use COVID protocols for a workday. **Motion**: A motion has been made by Bill for Council to accept Aiden's offer for an Eagle Scout project at Immanuel with the support of the property committee first. It was seconded by Bob and Emily and approved unanimously.

Finance – In brief, the finance report shows generous and special giving this past month.

Motion – A motion to extend the meeting by 10 minutes was made by Karen, second by Bill, and passed by the majority. <u>COVID Team Report</u> –

The status report discusses where we are currently. We are ahead of WCC by starting things earlier than metrics and recommendations from WCC indicate. We are going to be moving ahead with indoor service layouts and efficient seating efficiently, such as set up this Wednesday for a wedding on Saturday and then re-arrange seating as needed for Sunday worship. Chairs have all been moved by Kim. COVID Team would like the Council to think over the next month about the things that are happening. Things are at a critical stage and it is a tough time for people as we are anxious for things to be normal again. Our goal of being back in person is something we want to make happen, but to do so safely and inclusively.

Discussion:

We are all looking for compassion and balance as well as care for our neighbor.

A positive message of masking, and increased communications with a positive message of support for following the COVID protocols to care for our neighbor o congregation members may be of help.

We have an appreciation for the work of the COVID team and support the Immanuel staff. Some decisions may have to be made in the moment, so a trust of Immanuel staff and Council to lead the congregation is important when such decisions are being made.

Reports will be voted on by email for approval.

Adjournment – Sandy made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Karen, and unanimously passed.

THANK YOU IMMANUEL FOR HELPING MALAWI

We were able to help our companion synod Zomba in Malawi, Africa as they struggle with the effects of the pandemic, thanks to the generosity of so many in our congregation. The donations for Malawi COVID relief last month totaled \$2000! And Immanuel's Trust Fund approved a matching grant to double the total. This emergency help for Malawi is in addition to the donation in February from our ZIP group (Zomba-Immanuel Partners), which voted to send its entire account of \$4900 to Malawi in February when the crisis in Malawi peaked. Thank you, again, for donations to ZIP fundraisers that raised this money: Chili Feed, "The Day Lily Dig", and thrift sale (June 4th this year).



RECENT COVID SITUATION IN MALAWI

The ELCM churches originally stopped having services and began again by June; they are doing two Sunday services to have fewer people at each one, and hand washing buckets were provided at entrances. They praise God for protecting them. Zikomo Yesu, thank you Jesus.

As of April, wearing facemasks in public is required by law in Malawi, there is a curfew after 9pm, and events must have fewer than 50 people. One concern is COVID spreading on public transport, and riders are warned to wear masks, social distance, and keep windows open even if air conditioning is available.

The situation in Malawi has improved a lot since the terrifying situation in February when hospitals were overwhelmed due to COVID. The AstraZeneca vaccine began to be available in Malawi in March, and over a quarter million people in Malawi have been vaccinated including some ELCM members we know, so there is optimism.

WE SUPPORT THE ELC-MALAWI AS THEY FIGHT COVID

The ELCM has had community volunteers going door-to-door educating people about preventing the spread of COVID. COVID relief money from the ELCA has been used for child feeding centers, face mask making, COVID education, and supporting people not working due to COVID. Bishop Joseph Bvumbwe made a video to personally express appreciation to our synod for support sent during the pandemic. Sadly, we know that his sister-in-law (Maria Bvumbwe's sister) died of COVID.

Instead of deciding what problem our Malawi companions have and fixing it for them, we support their projects. So instead of sending them facemasks to use to slow the spread of COVID, we listened when the ELCM (ELC-Malawi) indicated their facemask making project had a need for money -- for cloth, thread, and repairs to sewing machines. By making masks themselves, they are exercising commercial skills and producing culturally appropriate products. And when they buy materials locally, it supports the local economy.
