


A Blessing for Easter by Kate Bowler

#### **Update on the Blessing Bags and Blessing Box Ministry**

As many of you may know, we have a Blessing Box located outside of church that contains practical hygiene and household items for anyone in our community to take as needed. We also have Blessing Bags assembled at all times in the Narthex. These bags are meant to be carried in your car and distributed when you come across a person in our community asking for help. The bags contain travel size toiletry items, individually packaged snacks, seasonal items such as hats (thank you knitters!), hand warmers, socks, rain ponchos, etc. We have also compiled a list of local resources, food pantries, and shelters to include with each bag.

If you are able to help out with this ministry, please feel free to take a bag or two for distribution. If you are able to help with a donation, there is a bin under the small table next to the drinking fountain in the Narthex. The items we currently need most are:

Rain Ponchos/Umbrellas
Travel Size Shampoo, Conditioner, Lotion, Deodorant (hotel items work great!)
Individually Packaged Snacks (Protein Bars, Dried Fruit, Cereal Bars)
Hand wipes or sanitizer
Free meal or gas cards and coupons
Bar soap

Bug spray

#### **Old Clothing and Shoes**

Hope Gospel Mission and most of the thrift stores in the area will take unwanted clothing and shoes. If you have old socks, torn t-shirts or clothing that is not wearable, simply put in a bag and label as such.

#### **Building Supplies and Old Furniture**

Hope Gospel Mission Building Center and Habitat for Humanity will take building supplies and old furniture and many times they will do pick-up.

#### **Mattresses**

#### **LONGINGS AND LOSSES:**

At the beginning of 2022 the council made a goal to do a listening exercise, recognizing that The Church at large is in a time of change and the pandemic created many experiences of change, loss, and grief, in order to better understand what members of the congregation were thinking and feeling. The *Longings and Losses* exercise is a spiritual listening exercise taken from the Faith+Lead resource, *Navigating a New Future*. Here is a description of the exercise from this resource: "The spiritual practice of lament invites participants to enter into a process of lamenting the longings and losses that accompany any type of change that occurs as we faithfully innovate. Fears of loss can prevent congregations from pursuing faithful innovation altogether. Lamenting can create space for grieving losses as well as building trust in God's direction for the future."

Conversations were held between April and October 2022 and the council allowed for space at several council meetings during 2022 to share what they heard. Here are some of the responses from individuals as compiled by the council:

What's one wish you have for your congregation?

- That visitors and new members would feel as welcome as those who have been coming to Immanuel for many years.
- Continue the warm welcome when entering church and a safe place for all to worship.
- More small group experiences in person.
- See church membership grow but keep the older population engaged in worship.
- See more members return to church physically post COVID.
- Keeping things more simple and streamlined/balanced.
- A wish for broadening the Caring/Eucharistic Ministry for the most vulnerable, and a wish for adding ongoing support or circles for grieving or other needs
- A longing to value elder members

What's something that used to happen in the congregation that you wish would return?

- More mentoring opportunities between high school students and younger students.
- Increase in attendance and full choir back
- Opportunities for engaging conversation.
- Connect Wednesday night and Sunday morning families/students.
- Presentation of the bread and wine/church rituals (and organ music!).
- Return to previous service time (9:30)
- Returning to coffee and snacks on Sunday morning and meals on Wednesdays.

What's one thing you fear might be lost as your congregation moves into the future?

- Appreciation of the history and legacy of the older members of our congregation. This would have more emphasis for the younger and new members of Immanuel.
- That all genders and age groups' spiritual needs are met, i.e., small groups.
- Church may struggle with the younger population and participation.
- Experience of worship may not be as meaningful as it has been in the past.

What's something that has changed that you feel is a loss in the life of the congregation?

- Keeping high school students engaged and coming to confirmation/church.
- A working organ.
- Watching church Live or on YouTube may not bring folks back to church physically.
- Sharing the Peace by handshake or hugging.
- Grieved the loss of high church rituals such as the presentation of bread and wine, communion served by elders, and passing the plate at offering



# No Mow May 2023 Chippewa Valley Pollinator Partnership

It's that time of year when warm weather motivates gardeners and homeowners to tend to their lawns with regular mowing. To promote and educate the community about the critical period of pollinator emergence, the month of May has been designated as **No Mow May** in a growing

number of communities like Eau Claire.

The goal of **No Mow May** is to provide early pollinators, such as bees and butterflies, more native plants/food by reducing mowing during a month when these types of resources are limited to pollinators.

At the April meeting, Immanuel Council members agreed to support this community-wide endeavor by not mowing the church grounds during the month of May.



Signs explaining **No Mow May** will be acquired through JONAH and placed in various areas on the church lawn. Hopefully, this will encourage neighbors/others to do the same, allowing common flowering plants like dandelion, clover, creeping Charlie and violet to provide food for hungry pollinators, when many other flowers are not yet in bloom. 
The church has a mower or you are welcome to use your own.




# Trip to the Holy Land
