Grace upon Grace! "..from his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace."

This November, as we celebrate stewardship in our congregation, I can't help but think of all the blessings God has given us. I am truly in awe of the way God is at work in our congregation. Immanuel has been a busy place this fall! This year it has become even more evident how WoW (Worship and learning On Wednesdays) is growing and changing lives of youth and families. Five years ago when WoW began, we averaged around 45 people in attendance at worship. Five years later as we kicked off WoW, we had over 90 people at worship! Our classrooms are full with learners from children's JOF (Journey of Faith), Confirmation, and SHYN.

Our Sunday JOF is growing too! We now need the youth room as a classroom on Sunday mornings. Alyssa Engedal, our Faith Formation Minister, reported that we have averaged 45 children in JOF combined Sunday & Wednesday per week. In my 6-8th grade confirmation class, we have 21 students, and a high school youth room bursting at the seams each week. Alyssa reported that this is the most participants in the Youth and Family Ministry program that she has had in her 6 years of ministry, and most likely several years before that. What an amazing thing to celebrate!

Our ministry is growing and that is indeed an amazing thing! Of course considering this, we have experienced some growing pains in the process. The Confirmation class is too large to meet with group guides in the library, so we now meet in Luther Hall. There is no extra classroom space for JOF. The SHYN group meets in the youth room, but it is a very small space. We need more food for meals, more wine and wafers for communion, more hands, and more energy. During the school day we now have 5 preschool classes meeting throughout the week, as opposed to the 2 when I first started here at Immanuel. With all of these ministries added to current ministries, our building is in constant use. We also partner with LSS, JONAH, and EXPO, who have regular meetings at Immanuel. Our staff has been working diligently to keep up with all of the new ministry needs! We were also recently blessed to welcome eight new families to our congregation whom we celebrated on Sunday, October 8th.

When you support Immanuel Lutheran Church with your gifts of money, time, and energy you are making all of this ministry possible. Without your support, we couldn't do any of this! We cannot thank you enough for the love and energy you share with our congregation. We are truly blessed to have you. Never forget what a blessing you are!

Consecration Sunday Is Coming

Congregations that approach financial stewardship from a biblical perspective do not view the money Christians give to their church merely as a way to pay its bills. Rather, such congregations see financial contributions as a way to help people grow spiritually in their relationship with God by supporting their church's mission and ministry with a percentage of their incomes.

Our congregations finance committee has selected the *New Consecration Sunday Stewardship Program* as a way to teach the biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving in our stewardship education emphasis this year.

New Consecration Sunday is based on the biblical philosophy of the need of the giver to give for his or her own spiritual development, rather than on the need of

the church to receive. Instead of treating people like members of a social club who should pay dues, we will treat people like followers of Jesus Christ who want to give unselfishly as an act of discipleship. *New Consecration Sunday* encourages people toward proportionate and systematic giving in response to



the question, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to give?" During morning worship on Consecration Sunday, we are asking our attendees and members to make their financial commitments to our church's missionary, benevolent, and educational ministries in this community and around the world.

Every attendee and member who completes and *Estimate of Giving Card* does so voluntarily by attending morning worship on Consecration Sunday. We urge people to attend who feel strongly opposed to completing a card. The procedure is done in such a way that no one feels personal embarrassment if he or she chooses not to fill out a card.

We will do no home solicitation to ask people to complete cards. During morning worship our guest leader will conduct a brief period of instruction and inspiration, climaxed by members making their commitments as a confidential act of worship.

We encourage participation in Consecration Sunday events through the Consecration Sunday team and governing board members. Since we will make no follow-up visits to ask people to complete their cards, we will make every effort to inform, inspire and commit every one to attend Consecration Sunday worship.

Meeting called to order at 1900

Devotion: Curt gave a devotion

Columbarium: Betty Gertner presented on the Columbarium proposal. Betty recommended we first survey the congregation for interest. She asks that a council member take a leading role. Marcia and Betty can help put together a committee. Keith motioned to allow Betty and Marcia to gather as an interest group. Dave seconded. Keith will liaison. 6 ayes, 5 opposed, carried.

Keith moved to approve July minutes, Peggy seconded, carried.

New Business

ZIP proposal: ZIP requested Pastor Jamie attend Zomba trip, 2 weeks June-July 2019. Congregation will finance pulpit supply. Peggy moved to approve ZIP proposal. Dave seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Old Business

- 1. Organ repair: Pastor Jamie located a company in Iowa who can either fix the organ or sell it for parts. Will need estimate for this. Letter of termination received from Murray. Keith moved to officially end Murray's employment, Peggy seconded, motion carried.
- 2. Door locks: Dave planning to install key fob system. Parents would have a fob programmed to let them in during pre-school. Dave donating fobs.
- 3. AV system upgrade: Work continues. \$10,000 from trust fund, \$2,000 donated
- 4. Flower Bed Rejuvenation: Mary working hard.
- 5. AED: \$800-\$1000 estimated. Question required maintenance. Lang will contact Phillips vendor and report at October meeting.
- 6. Copier: Will continue with old printer/copier for now. Proposed new EO Johnson service contract \$1144/yr for 6000 copies. Discussed using less paper, use projector for Council agenda/notes.

Reports

Finance: Dave gave summary. Last 2 months were better. Improving. Revenue and expenses are both below expected. Expenses about \$10,000 more than revenue for

current year. Peggy moved to accept finance report, Mindy seconded, carried.

Pastor's Report: Written report submitted.

Property: Landscaping and invasive species removal/prairie restoration around church with Nick Haus for Sunday, September 30th after church. Brick around circular window in library may need masonry work. Various ceiling tiles have water stains, concern for leak in roof. Roofer contacted, info pending.

Other:

1)Registered sex offender who had a covenant with Immanuel is in jail for repeat offense. Covenant is void.

2)James Peterson is a registered sex offender who has been worshiping. Pastor Jamie discussed presenting a covenant outlining expectations. Keith motioned to enter into a covenant with James Peterson. Peggy seconded. Carried unanimously.


3)Keith nominated by Peggy to fill out Larry's term as VP. Seconded by Lang, motion carried unanimously.
