Dear people of Immanuel,

This year we have the very unique opportunity to celebrate an important anniversary. This November marks the fiftieth anniversary of the first woman ordained in the Lutheran Church. On November 22nd, 1970 Rev. Elizabeth Platz was ordained as the first woman pastor in the LCA.

As a female minister in the church, I am in awe of the work of the women who came before me to make these important strides. It's important to learn our history and to continue to grow as people of faith. Women have been a part of the church since the beginning. Mary Magdalene, the first female apostle, was one of Jesus' closest companions. She was the first to see the risen Christ and proclaim the resurrection. This witness has continued through the ages through faithful women. In times when women could not serve as ministers in an official capacity, women still led and served the church in whatever way they could, with whatever gifts they had. Let's take some time to give thanks together for their witness!

At the Lord's table we gather with the faithful of every time and place, trusting that the promises of God will be fulfilled and that all tears will be wiped away in the new Jerusalem.

Sunday, November 29th First Sunday in Advent

Introduction from Sundays and Seasons Although the historical record is sketchy, it appears that our Advent arose out of a season of fasting to prepare for baptisms at Epiphany. By the sixth century, an eschatological emphasis was present. Our Advent comprises the four Sundays before Christmas. Each year, the first Sunday deals with our readiness for divine judgment, the second Sunday the ministry of John the Baptist, the third Sunday the Baptist's call to a repentant life, and only on the fourth Sunday a narrative concerning the birth of Jesus. God comes, in the past in the history of Israel and the incarnation of Jesus, in the present in the word and sacrament of each Sunday and in the sufferings of our time, and in the future at the end of all things. The lectionary appoints readings to fit this pattern, and its tone stands in stark contrast to our society's weeks of preparation for Christmas. Liturgical advice to keep a meaningful Advent without a Decemberlong celebration of Christmas is meant not to be a kill-joy, but to awake our longing for the surprising ways that God comes to us.

Gathering

Devotion- Natalie and Calvin, our student representatives to Council, shared their faith journey. Both student members had attended Luther Bible Camp, the National Youth Gathering, and other Immanuel Youth trips, like traveling to Colorado. They found these experiences to be very beneficial. In many cases, the students found that these trips were a great way to relate to others of a similar age in faith and activities. These experiences have provided a strong base for their faith and over the years strengthened their faith. The Houston National Youth gathering was an amazing trip as the students experienced a stadium filled with thousands of people their age coming together in worship. The students found that they developed friendships with others from across the country as well as strengthening friendships within the Immanuel youth church group as they participated in these faith-based trips. In summary, the youth trips and gatherings have been essential and have motivated students to keep up with faith practices of prayer and thankfulness, provided opportunities to recharge their faith, have helped them in facing difficult situations and reaffirmed for them how much God can do and how beautiful the work is that he does.

Minutes

September- 2020 Approved via email

Reports

Pastor - None at this time

Property - Bill submitted a very detailed report outlining the recent and continued work being done, especially concerning the details surrounding the preparation for the upcoming painting and work being done in the sanctuary in November. Motion to approve the property reports was made, seconded and approved unanimously.

Finance - Reports submitted to share drive. \$2K expenditure on streaming equipment in September. Expenses below budgeted for the month of September. Expenses about \$1500 more than giving for the month. Motion to approve the financial reports was made, seconded and approved unanimously.

New Business

COVID planning committee report (found on the shared drive) - Karen shared with the Council a report on the committee's progress in developing a cohesive approach to Immanuel's work in meeting the needs of our members and community as well as the building itself during this time in which the church navigates the current health situation and public health recommendations. Protocols will be implemented at which time in-person activities return or needs arise. Monitoring of programs, structures, protocols, and supports will be continuous in the work done by this committee to best care for our faith community.

Old Business

Paycheck Protection Program - Lang updated Council by giving a review of the Cares Act/PPP, which was initiated to assist in covering expenses in April, May, and June (approx 8 weeks). It is now possible to apply for loan forgiveness. There is a streamlined process through RCU and the US Department of Treasury to apply for loan forgiveness for loans under \$50K. Applicants must have maintained approximately the same number of employees and have used 75% of the loan for payroll; both of which Immnauel has met. Discussion continued regarding the structure of repaying. If payments were to be put into effect (for which loan forgiveness is not applied or loan forgiveness is denied), monthly loan payments would be scheduled over a 2-year or 5-year time period. Repaying the loan vs applying for forgiveness was debated. A motion to apply for forgiveness was made by Sandy, seconded by Jennifer, and passed by a vote of 8 aye and 3 no votes.

Closing Prayer - Lang closed in prayer.

Adjournment - Becky made a motion to adjourn the meeting, Sandy seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.


Prayer of Gratitude, ~ written by Sarah Buteux. Posted on MINEmergent's Daily Communique, January 18, 2013
