

Meeting called to order at 1900

New Business

Insurance Policy: Beth Kroeger Senior Account Manager from Church Mutual presented at the beginning of the meeting. She summarized Immanuel's policy. Written summary provided to church council members. Her email was provided which is her preferred contact method, bkroeger@churchmutual.com

Summary was fairly extensive, included: 1)Coverage in all 50 states but not internationally. 2)Total property coverage is \$2,878,400. 3)If we claim church contents, photographic proof may be required. 4) Deductible is \$500 per claim. We would save \$336 per year if we went up to \$1000 deductible per claim. 5) Last claim was 2006, a theft. We may have not claimed things when we could have, such as with the siding last winter. 6) Liability claims do not have a deductible. Examples would include falls. Our liability coverage is \$1,000,000 per claim, \$3,000,000 annually. 7) \$10,000 to help pay medical bills of someone hurt in the church or on a church activity, in excess of their base insurance. 8) \$300,000 in sexual misconduct/molestation coverage. 9)Personal auto insurance is primary, but church has significant excess coverage if needed when someone is driving a personal vehicle or church rented vehicle. 10) If a business rents the church they should have a certificate of liability for their own insurance. 11) Beth will send prior premium information over the last few years to Lang, he will forward to the council. She believes rates have been going down previously and leveled off recently.

Prior Meeting Minutes: Peggy motioned to accept the August minutes, Emilie seconded, passed unanimously.

Constitution Changes: Those who have not reviewed it will do so and will bring comments to next meeting.

Finance: Written report submitted to google drive. We brought in \$1,000 more than we spent in August. \$500 in the red for the year. \$1,176 left in Maintenance budget with 540 more coming in each month. May use this for broken tables, tree work. Peggy moved accept to report, Keith seconded, passed unanimously.

Pastor's Report: Written report submitted to Drive. Fall retreat upcoming, Janet to cover.

Property: Bill presented. Will ask for bid on cutting down spruce tree. Tree trimming of branches over roof needed for fall work day. Some round Tables in coffee area are broken, at least 4. Pastor Jamie discussed replacing these with round tables. Bill will inventory, come up with how many to buy. Thrift sale Oct. 4.


Gratitude Sunday, November 10
