

Sabbatical Musings

Greetings congregation! Thank you to everyone who asked about my sabbatical or prayed for me in my absence. Thank you to the entire congregation for supporting me in this time of rest. How was it, you may ask? I'm grateful to say it was wonderful! It was time well-spent centered on family, fun, and the outdoors. Still, I continue to process what this sabbatical meant to me. I know it was important, and as the weeks and months pass I think I will better understand the role this time of rest played and will continue to play in my life and ministry.

I have already shared some stories from my summer during worship, and I will continue to do this going forward. You will get bits and pieces of what I learned and what I am reflecting on as we move forward together.



Ideally, a sabbatical should remind us, as one pastor noted, that rest is not a privilege but a human need. Rest should have a regular rhythm within our lives. As *Burnout* authors Emily & Amelia Nagoski discovered, 42% of our day should be some form of rest. As our scriptures teach us one day a week should be devoted to rest, especially rest that includes

spiritual nourishment and community.

As I sit in the busyness of September, I hope that my sabbatical can bring a sense of sabbath into my regular routine. I hope that you, too, can find what that means in your own life. I would like to continue to explore this together. I plan to do a sermon series & conversations on Sabbath to help us do this. Watch for this sometime in the coming year!

In the meantime rest in these wise words of Sabbath from Barbara Brown Taylor:



"At least one day in every seven, pull off the road and park the car in the garage. Close the door to the tool shed and turn off the computer. Stay home not because you are sick but because you are well. Talk someone you love into being well with you. Take a nap, a walk, an hour for lunch. Test the premise that you are worth more than you can produce that even if you spent one whole day being good for nothing you would still be precious God's sight- and when you get anxious because you are convinced that this is not so, re-

member that your own conviction is not required. This is a commandment. Your worth has already been established, even when you are not working. The purpose of the commandment is to woo you to the same truth."

Raising Good Humans (by Hunter Clarke-Fields) Book Group

Join us for Raising Good Humans! This book is a great way to look at personal parenting practices, the 'why' behind why we do those practices for each of us, and how to do what we 'aspire' to do as parents rather than what we may have been doing. It involves reflection, mindfulness and being intentional with exercises in the book. We will break down some of these practices/exercises and complete them within our book group. 
All parents, potential parents, grandparents and even those who support parents (directly/indirectly) are welcome to join this group.

Gathering Registration - \$5,225
Food for the week - \$1800
Campsites - \$400
Gas - \$950
Vehicle rental - \$1800
Parking, firewood & other incidentals - \$150
Mileage (paid for the non-rented vehicle) - \$500

A week together growing in God's love & in fellowship together - PRICELESS (but also, over \$10,000!). Each participant pays a deposit, but the rest of our trips are paid for through our fundraising efforts. We appreciate your ongoing generosity which makes these life changing and faith forming trips a possibility for Immanuel's youth!
