Blessing of the Animals



October fourth is the feast day of St. Francis, known to be the patron saint of animals. Mindset Monday - Bible Study

Mindset Monday - Somatic Practices for the Spiritual Journey

Somatics means "relating to the body, as distinct from the mind."



God gave us a body and feelings and thoughts. We have an intricate nervous system, and along with our emotions and thinking mind, this informs our responses to the world around us. In these somatic classes, we will practice body and breath awareness to alleviate stress, become aware of our body and emotional responses, hold space for feeling and healing, and build resiliency for our spiritual journey.

When we study scripture, we often use our mind and intellect. When we settle and sense how our body is responding to scripture, we are using somatic awareness. When we pray, we are talking to God. When we meditate, we listen for the response. Somatic practices make room for the listening and understanding of the next right action for our spiritual journey. There are aspects of somatic practice built right into our liturgical worship- singing together, praying in unison, communion and more. When we are more familiar with these tools, church has an extra dimension of healing gifts for us.

Each month Sarah Aiken-Felling will bring a 45 minute set of practices that all will do together in a circle. These will be mostly breath and movement with a small amount of reflection about body sensation awareness. You do not have to have any previous experience, because all practices will be easy to follow along with. Sarah will create a set of practices that will help us settle and harmonize together. These practices will come from 25 years of experience studying the body and wellness through a Traditional Chinese Medicine lens, and what has been quick, easy and effective in her busy parenting and work life. They include vagus nerve resets, somatic experiencing practices, acupressure, breathwork and qi gong. Class will meet October 23, November 27 and December 18 from 6:30 - 7:15 pm.



Holy, Happy & Healthy - H3

Tuesday Morning Group: This group started Tuesday, September 12th and is studying the Book of Jeremiah and discussing Reverend Kenneth Wheeler's book, *US The Resurrection of American Terrorism*. They meet every Tuesday at 9:30 am at Immanuel, but also have the option to Zoom. They warmly welcome new folks to join!

Monday Evening Group: This group meets Monday evenings from 6:30 – 8:00 pm. Join in person or from the comfort of your home via Zoom! New members are welcome at any time! This year we will read and discuss, *Short Stories by Jesus: The Enigmatic Parables of a Controversial Rabbi*. The author, Amy-Jill Levine, takes readers back in time to understand how the original Jewish audience would have understood the parables told by Jesus. She then interprets these stories for the contemporary reader, "showing how the parables are not just about Jesus, but are also about us – and when read rightly, still challenge and provoke us two thousand years later."



How Are You Wired? - Dr. Michael C. Rehak

Each person has a primary orientation to one of the five senses. The majority of people have brains which are wired to either hearing or sight - auditory or visual. In this workshop participants will gain understanding in how they are wired. Being either auditory or visual can dictate behavioral preferences including where you prefer to sit in public venues (including church and

classrooms), driving a car, talking on the phone, the words we use, dress, sleep, travel, and so much more. Understanding how you are wired allows you to have grace with yourself and grace with others wired differently.

Dr. Michael C. Rehak will lead this 45-minute interactive presentation after worship on October 22 and again on November 5. He will also lead this presentation on Wednesday, October 18 at 6:30 pm. This workshop is appropriate for participants high school age and above.

Green Team News



Three eco-friendly fall tips:

1. Like those autumnal scented candles? Most candles are made from paraffin wax, which is derived from fossil fuels. Instead, look for soy or beeswax candles and consider buying from a small local business.

2. Opt for planet-friendly treats on Halloween. Instead of candies wrapped in plastic, go for boxed or foilwrapped goodies. The boxes can be recycled and foil wrappers can be combined with other aluminum foil scraps to make a large ball before also throwing in the recycling bin.

3. Leaves are a renewable resource. Mow over them (without a collection attachment) a few times. This breaks them up into small pieces which can decompose quickly and then eventually disappear altogether into the lawn, or layer directly onto flower and vegetable gardens to create an extra layer against the elements and weeds.
