
Immanuel is one of three ELCA churches that maintain the Lutheran Cemetery on Omaha Street.



# Dr James Boulter of UWEC will present a series of environmental talks at St John Lutheran starting September 11. It discusses the caring for creation ELCA statement and several other interesting topics:

#### Whole Sustainability - Living a Whole, Faithful, Sustainable Life for All

Although climate change is an existential crisis, it is merely one facet of the coupled threats that face humanity and the natural world. A more inclusive approach to these challenges lies in the field of sustainability studies. Rather than focusing exclusively on

challenges, I would like to emphasize how the world might be different if we could tackle them together; and one exemplary framework for this is the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals, or SDGs. In general, I find that most Americans are not even aware of these, although people in the developing world may be more so. However, they are meaningful to all societies regardless of development status. In terms of relationship to faith, Pope Francis' remarkable text, *Laudato Si*, speaks in a compelling manner to the problems in our society that have led to these challenges as well as the solutions that are available by approaching them from a standpoint of sustainable development. Additionally, three of the ELCA social statements address themes consistent with sustainable development, plus the upcoming social statement on climate change. With these as context, we will examine the current state of the world, some solutions to the conjoined crises that face us, and a vision for restored health and relationships.

#### Sessions:

- 1: September 11<sup>th</sup>, 10:15AM at the St. John's Sanctuary Sustainability and Sustainable Development

  Looking at the overarching themes of the four sessions, we'll discuss definitions of weak vs. strong sustainability and the basis of the 17 UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and then focus on a vision of how some of the proposed solutions in the SDGs might be consistent with values inspired by our faith traditions.
- 2: September 18<sup>th</sup>, 10:15AM at the St. John's Sanctuary Planet (SDGs 6, 13-15; Caring for Creation ELCA Social Statement)

We'll look at the coupled crises represented by climate, air and water pollution, biodiversity loss, and their importance to humanity. Just these challenges appear overwhelming – is there a way that we can find hope through them all? And how is our response informed by our faith?

# 3: September 25<sup>th</sup>, 10:15AM at the St. John's Sanctuary - Society (SDGs 1-5, 7, 11, 16; Church in Society ELCA Social Statement)

We'll start by examining some of the progress that has been made in the current millennium, and reasons for hope for more. We'll also look at the US compared to other nations, and then discuss some of the challenges that remain at home and abroad. How do we view our successes (and failures) as Christians?

# 4: October 2<sup>nd</sup>, 10:15AM at the St. John's Sanctuary - Economy (SDGs 8-10, 12; Economic Life ELCA Social Statement)

Again, we'll briefly touch on some of the progress that has been made and we'll cover some of the challenges that face us. Is there a vision for how some of the proposed solutions in the SDGs may be consistent with values inspired by our faith traditions? We'll conclude with how these 16 goals are integrated and the global effort to achieve them – goal 17.
