As Ephesians 2:8-10 reminds us, we are what God has made us — people whom God has created by grace to live in union with Jesus Christ and has prepared to live faithful, fruitful lives by the power of the Holy Spirit. In Jesus Christ, God has reconciled us to God and to each other. As we gather around word and sacraments, this life in Christ is what defines, shapes and guides us as a community of faith, the church. By God’s grace we can and do live confidently and generously in this community of faith and in service of others. ELCA vital congregations work to strengthen their relationship with God, nurture relationships with each other and create a strong presence with their community. **“God’s work. Our hands.” Sunday** is one way for congregations to discover ways to build on each of these connections.

Helpful information:

1. All eight ELCA Lutheran churches in Eau Claire will be working together on service projects in our community.
2. Immanuel will have a worship service at 9:30 am, and there will be no learning/fellowship. There will then be a joint worship service at 11:15 am at Grace Lutheran, 202 W Grand Avenue.
3. At Grace bag lunches will be available for volunteers to pick up and take to work sites following the worship.
4. The kick-off date for signing up for projects is Sunday, September 8.
5. There will be many projects to choose from - some requiring manual labor, many that do not, some outdoors, many indoors - there is something for everyone!
6. If you can’t volunteer on September 29, consider making a donation toward one of the projects, ***Sleep in Heavenly Peace*** (see related article).
7. The Beacon House 16th Annual Hike for the Homeless is on Saturday, September 28 at Phoenix Park. This event will be part of “God’s work. Our hands.”
8. The Mexican Consulate will be at Immanuel on Saturday, September 28. This, too, will be a “God’s work. Our hands.” service opportunity!



Sleep in Heavenly Peace (SHP) is an American nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization that builds and delivers beds to children who don't have beds to sleep in. Luke and Heidi Mickelson founded SHP in 2012 in Twin Falls, Idaho. As of 2019, the organization has 150 chapters around the United States (one is in Osseo, WI) and has built over 4000 beds.

When Luke Mickelson was a youth group leader at his church, the group built beds for a member family of the church that was in need. He then built a bed with his family and offered it for free on Facebook. When people in the community heard about the effort, many donated bedding items, which encouraged Mickelson to move forward with the project. The organization grew at such a pace that

Mickelson decided to leave his job and run SHP full-time.

The web television series *Returning the Favor* featured Mickelson and SHP on an episode in February 2018. CNN honored Mickelson as a CNN Hero of 2018.

Every bed is handcrafted and constructed by volunteers, and no experience is necessary. Each bed is delivered to an appreciative home, complete with mattresses, pillows and bedding.

What does becoming a sanctuary denomination mean for the ELCA?

In its simplest form, becoming a sanctuary denomination means that the ELCA is publicly declaring that walking alongside immigrants and refugees is a matter of faith. The ELCA Churchwide Assembly, the highest legislative authority of the ELCA, declared that when we preach on Sunday that Jesus told us to welcome, we will use our hands and voices on Monday to make sure it happens.

Being a sanctuary denomination does not call for any person, congregation or synod to engage in any illegal actions. We have a broken system regarding immigration, refugees and asylum-seekers. To declare ourselves a sanctuary church body is to say that we seek to provide concrete resources to assist the most vulnerable who are feeling the sharp edges of this broken system.

Being a sanctuary denomination is about loving our neighbors. While we may have different ideas about how to fix this broken system and may have different ways of loving our neighbors, our call to love our neighbor is central to our faith.

Being a sanctuary denomination will look different in different contexts. It may mean providing space for people to live; providing financial and legal support to those who are working through the immigration system; or supporting other congregations and service providers. We cannot mandate or direct our congregations and ministries to respond in specific ways. Each must work out what this means for them in their context.

While we don't yet know the full scope of the work that this declaration will open for the church, we do know that our faith communities are already doing sanctuary work. Sanctuary for a congregation may mean hosting English as a Second Language (ESL) classes; marching as people of faith against the detention of children and families; providing housing for a community member facing deportation; or, in some of our congregations, having thoughtful conversations about what our faith says about immigration. All of these are a step closer to sanctuary in our faith communities and sanctuary in our world for people who must leave their homes.

Except for our members whose ancestors were here before European settlement or others who were forced to come to the U.S. against their will, the ELCA is an immigrant church. Our decades long work with immigrants and refugees is how we practice our faith in the world. Lutherans started Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service, one of the nine refugee resettlement agencies in the U.S.

At our last churchwide assembly, we also committed to walking alongside Central American children and families fleeing their communities by passing the [AMMPARO](#) strategy (Accompanying Migrant Minors with Protection, Advocacy, Representation and Opportunities).

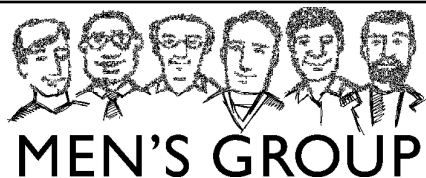
Through the AMMPARO strategy, we are also working through our global partners in Central America to alleviate the conditions that cause people to migrate. We support organizations and faith communities that work with deported migrants in Central America and advocate for the humane treatment of immigrants in Mexico. In the U.S., we have a network of 151 welcoming and sanctuary congregations that are committed to working on migration issues and a welcome for immigrant communities. The church also has five sanctuary synods (our regional structures), all of which do work with immigrants, refugees and asylum-seekers.

In baptism, we are brought into a covenantal relationship with Jesus Christ that commits us to strive for justice and peace in all the earth. Following the example of Martin Luther, we believe that advocacy is a crucial expression of baptismal identity. As a church, we have advocated for stopping the detention of children and families for decades. We have spoken out against family separation, sought a pathway to citizenship for community members who have lived in the U.S. for many years, and have taken steps to address the root causes of migration in a way that honors the humanity in people who must flee.

Being a sanctuary denomination means that we, as church together, want to be public and vocal about this work. At the same time, we will have conversations about what sanctuary means with many of our members and discern future action and direction. Welcoming people is not a political issue for us, it is a matter of faith.

IMMANUEL TO HOST 7TH ANNUAL MEXICAN CONSULATE VISIT

Immanuel, in collaboration with JONAH (Joining Our Neighbors Advancing Hope), will be hosting the Mexican Consulate Mobile Visit for the 7th time on Saturday, September 28 from 9:00-2:00. This annual visit by the Mexican Consulate from St. Paul, Minnesota is an opportunity for our Hispanic neighbors to receive the services and support of the Consulate. The Consulate is the only source for some crucial documents such as consular identification cards, passports and visas. Other services on hand will supply information on topics such as workplace safety, health care, immigration and local services. Last year Immanuel welcomed nearly 200 men, women, and children for this event. Peace Lutheran Church is hosting an introductory workshop for Stephen Ministries. The half day worship includes 3 sessions: Session 1 is Ministering to those experiencing grief; Session 2 is an introduction to Stephen Ministries; and Session 3 is how to care in a distinctively Christian way.
